What is Check In/Check Out?

PBIS Has Found that When behavior expectations are taught in a clean and positive manner about 85% of students respond appropriately. However, about 5-15% of children need a little extra coaching in order to learn and perform the expected behaviors. Perhaps these students need extra repetition, steps broken down into smaller pieces or extra attention from a caring adult so they feel motivated and encouraged to make the right choices.

At CLOVERGALE, HOWLER'S HEROES, IS OUT EXTRA SUPPORT PROGRAM! Students who are part of Howler's HEREOS will check in with an adult at the beginning of the day and at the end of the day. These students will also check in with their teachers during the school day to reflect on their goals.
